Observation and Field Notes Observational data refer to the raw materials an observer collects from observations, interviews, and materials, such as reports, that others have created. Data may be recorded in several ways: written notes, sketches, tape recordings, photographs, and videotapes.

Observation and Field Notes

Observation Notes and Information. Observation is a frequently used term in education programs. Teacher candidates observe and are observed multiple times over the course of their program. For our purposes, observation means careful, thoughtful noticing of work of the classroom—both what the teacher does and says and what the students do and say.

This can be done together with other observation methods in childcare: Work Samples and Photographs. Work Samples – these are the child's paintings, clay figures, drawings, cutouts, writings, and other creations.
